TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Seawall - Little Catalina

Deputy Mayor Stead pointed out that the roads in Little Catalina could benefit significantly from constructing a breakwater at the harbour entrance. He also explained that the town needs to plan future Municipal Capital Works projects at least 3 to 5 years into the future. To ensure these plans are efficient and include coordinated work on all underground infrastructure like town water and sewer, the town must know the provincial government's intent for their Capital Infrastructure, "like roads within town boundaries".

Motion #2024-12-03-6899 - Stead/Stagg

Be it resolved that the Mayor and Deputy Mayor lobby the government through letters and meetings to have the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure install a breakwater and seawalls to protect provincial roads in Little Catalina and

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provide their intended timelines for resurfacing Route 237 and provincial roads in Melrose and Little Catalina.

Church Road - Little Catalina

Deputy Mayor Stead pointed out that he had addressed his concern with the poor condition of Church Road in Little Catalina several times over the past few months without success. While all of the council understand that the Public Works maintenance team is stretched to its limit, it is clear that the road is an obvious hazard to residents attending services in the town. With this in mind, the council supported the intent that the road repair becomes a Public Works maintenance team priority for repair before winter sets in.
